**Coaches Comments:** Louisville ends drought. The Louisville Lions defeated the Elmwood-Murdock Knights 48-14 last Friday night in Louisville. Prior to Friday night's contest the Knights had defeated the Lions 14 consecutive years going back to 1999. It only took Louisville four plays to score their first touchdown following the opening kickoff on an 18 yard pass from Daniel Stohlmann to Nic Snodgrass. The Knights answered on the next series with a 10 play 65 yard drive ending on Dalton Lindburg 7 yard run. The score at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter was tied 7 – 7. I felt we were in a good position at that point. We answered their quick TD with a nice drive and we were moving the ball early in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. We knew that Louisville had an explosive offense and thought we needed to sustain some long drives, take some chances on 4<sup>th</sup> down to try to keep Louisville's offense off the field. Louisville stopped EM on a 4<sup>th</sup> and 1 early in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. The floodgates opened up after that. Louisville scored 27 unanswered points in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. Louisville executed very well. They force you to make a lot of open field tackles and we took some bad angles and paid for it. I thought we could go toe to toe with them when we had the ball but their momentum carried over to the defense. Louisville played an excellent football game. The Knights host Brownell-Talbot in a Homecoming contest next Friday. Game time is 7:00 p.m.
